Your Journey to becoming a Foster Carer

Following the completion of your application form and an initial home visit, the fostering application process usually takes between 3 to 6 months to complete. Each assessment is slightly different as each family is different, but all assessments must follow a similar course. Below is a breakdown of the stages step-by-step, so you know what to expect.

Stage 1

Application Stage

Initial enquiry and chat with the Empower Family Team.

Home Visit

An initial home visit will be coordinated with you.

Application Form

You will be invited to submit an application form.

Assessment

Proceed to the assessment stage.

Stage 2

Assessment Stage

Medical and DBS checks will commence.

Training

You will be invited to our skills to fostering training.

References

Employment and financial reference checks.

Assessor Visits

An assessor is allocated to complete your assessment.

Stage 3

Approval Stage

You will be invited to attend panel where a decision of recommendation may be made.

ADM

The Agency Decision Maker (ADM) will make the final decision to approve you as a foster carer.

Congratulations

Congratulations on your approval you will now be allocated your own supervising social worker.

Becoming a Foster Carer

Empower fostering are registered with Ofsted to care for children and young people between the ages of 0-18 years old. Statistics from the Fostering Network and Department for Education show there is a national shortage of approx 6800 carers in England. The main age range of placements needed are for children aged between 11-16 years.

Matching children and young people with the right Foster Carers is our highest priority. This is why we need **YOU**. We need a wide variety of Foster Carers able to meet the varying and dynamic needs of the children in our care; all of whom need a loving family and home.

We need Foster Carers to support us in caring for:

Teenagers

Teenagers are children too, and our young people will likely have had a chaotic childhood prior to coming into care and will come from a wide variety of backgrounds.

Sibling Groups

We strongly believe that all siblings should be placed together where appropriate and wherever possible.



Unaccompanied Asylum-Seeking Children (UASC)

Children and young people who are seeking asylum in the UK but have been separated from their parents or carers.

Parent & Child

These are specialist placements where a parent and their own child come to stay in your home, with you offering support and guidance.

Parent & child placements are often short term for 12-24 weeks and require Foster Carers to support in assessing parent(s) skills and abilities.

Solo Placements

All young people require lots of love but some children might need additional support and may not be able to be placed with other children or young people. These placements could be short term, emergency, or long term.

Fostering & Finances

We understand that finance is a part of any decision to become a Foster Carer. You need to be financially stable to provide a safe and caring home.

This is not just about the financial reward and as an agency we provide:

- A generous financial allowance
- Fostering is classed as self-employed and this attracts specialist tax allowances
- Training and access to advanced qualifications
- 24 hour 365 days per year support
- A minimum of 14 days paid annual leave each year
- You could earn up to £742 per week

Foster Carer pay rates are not regulated by the government so each private agency or local authority can decide how much they reward their carers. Local authorities often pay the minimum pay rates and private agency rates, like ours, are often much more generous.

Foster Carers are classed as self-employed and earn a weekly fostering allowance for each child or young person they look after. The amount of allowance paid depends on the type of placement. However, below is a helpful table of some of our fees and allowances:

Newly approved Foster Carer	Up to £470 per week
Experienced & fully trained Specialist Foster Carer	Up to £742 per week
Parent & Child Placement	Up to £845 per week
Sibling group	Up to £900 per week

Foster Carer Tax Benefits

Fosters Carers are treated as self-employed and the Government has introduced a special tax relief for Foster Carers.

Foster Carers are often exempt from paying income tax on their Fostering allowance in accordance with the governments Qualifying Care Relief.

The qualifying amount - 2 parts.

- Part 1 A fund amount of £18,140 for each household for a full year
- Part 2 A weekly amount for each cared for child or adult
 - £375 for children under 11
 - £450 for children aged 11 or over

If your total payments are less than the qualifying amout HMRC wil treat you as not making a profit or loss for the year, so you do not pay tax or Class 4 National Insurance on your foster care income.

Please note that it is recommended that you take independent advice on your own tax position and check the HMRC website for the latest allowances.

Can I foster if I am single?

Anyone can foster as long as they demonstrate that they have the skills and capacity to care for a young person. You need to be resilient, kind and have a good support network around you.

How long does the process take?

The length of time for assessments varies depending on individual circumstances but we aim to complete assessment within three to five months on average.

Do I have to have a spare room?

Yes, you do need to have a spare room. All children must have a room of their own unless they are a sibling group and the social worker agrees that they can share a room.

I am over 60 can I apply?

We welcome applications from people of any age and there is no upper age limit. You will have a medical with your GP and as long as you are physically and emotionally fit enough to support young people then age is not an issue.

How long will a child be matched with me?

This all depends on the individual child's plan and everyone is different. We will ensure that you are made aware of the plans from the start and will support you in decision making and ensure that the child's voice is heard in all decisions.

Will I get to meet the child before they move in with me?

We will always try to support a positive transition for all young people, although sadly this is sometimes not available. We will share all of the information we have and ensure that all young people are well matched with Foster Carers.

I have a criminal record can I still foster?

A previous conviction will not necessarily preclude you from fostering. Much will depend on the nature of the offence and when it occurred. We will carry out an enhanced DBS check and would ask that you are open and honest from the start with any convictions. This way we can assess whether you can continue on the assessment journey. Some convictions such as offences against children will preclude you but we will be honest with you about this from the start.

What training will I receive?

Empower Fostering employs a bespoke and tailored training program. Some of this is held online and some is face to face training. As part of your assessment we will run workshops on top of your Skills to Foster course. Again, these will be both face to face and online depending on the need at the time. We will try to be flexible and ensure that this fits around your life and the schedules of the young people in your care.
